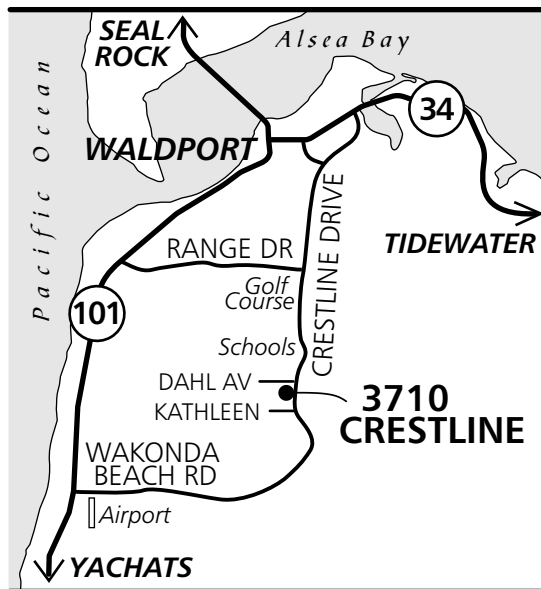


Waldport Food Share

An all volunteer agency of Food Share of Lincoln County serving hundreds of people monthly.

Dependent on the support of grocers and businesses, service clubs and churches, civic and charitable groups, and individual donations.

Expenses, other than food, are the cost of utilities and a phone. There are no paid positions here.

We serve many retired and disabled people with fixed incomes. We are also seeing more working families with children.

We receive USDA food through the Oregon Food Bank.

We are able to purchase goods with Food Share of Lincoln County and the other county pantries for greater savings

Much of the food comes as generous donations from the community.

Fresh produce is received from farms and people with gardens or fruit trees.

We shop carefully when we have to buy retail and we do wait for sales.

The procedure for getting a food box is simple and confidential and follows effective program guidelines.

Clients are allowed to come once a month, they have choices as their boxes are prepared for them. Everything is weighed and noted, and boxes are carried out for those who need assistance.

The need is here, now.
